Delivering a Cure: Management of Hepatitis C (HCV)

PROGRAM OVERVIEW

The presentation will consist of a general overview of Hepatitis C (HCV). This includes epidemiology, etiology, pathophysiology, pharmacotherapy and non-pharmacologic recommendations. The presentation will also emphasize diagnostic testing, labs, and liver staging that will guide and monitor treatment. Furthermore, guidance on treating HIV-HCV coinfections will be provided. As this presentation will likely be given to clinical pharmacists at the VA, the presentation will close with how the VA manages HCV infections. Direct-acting antiviral agents are fairly new to HCV treatment and pharmacists may not have a lot of direct experience with HCV. This presentation will allow pharmacists to learn about updates in HCV care. The registration fee for this program is FREE.
