PROGRAM OVERVIEW

This presentation focuses on the role of the PDMP as a tool to fight opioid misuse and abuse. Alabama has one of the highest rates of opioid prescribing in the country, yet PDMP use is not required for pharmacists. PDMP use is required for prescribers, but only under specific circumstances.
