## PROGRAM OVERVIEW

The sale of unregulated and often mislabeled substances—commonly referred to as “gas station drugs”—has expanded rapidly in convenience stores and vape shops. Marketed as legal alternatives or wellness products, these substances often contain psychoactive ingredients that pose significant risks to physical and mental health. This webinar will examine the evolving landscape of gas station drugs.
